The cost for the residence hall for 08-09 academic year is \$4,796 for women and \$4,235 for men. Students awarded the Kansas Enhancement Scholarship will pay only \$2,000 a year. Most students awarded this scholarship and enrolled in 16 credit hours a semester will pay less than \$1,500 a semester for room, board, loan of books, tuition and fees - by far the best value in higher education in the state of Kansas. FYI	<p><u>AFTER JANUARY 1ST, STUDENTS & PARENTS MAY BEGIN COMPLETING THE FAFSA:</u> Students must have all the necessary forms before attempting to fill out the FAFSA. With all the forms gathered, filling out the FAFSA should be a snap. Here's a list of necessary forms: 1) social security card, 2) driver's license, 3) student's income tax returns, W-2 forms, and 1099 forms for the previous year, 4) parents' income taxes returns, W-2 forms and 1099 forms for the previous year (if student is a dependent or under the age of 24), 5) records of other untaxed income, received such as welfare benefits, social security benefits, TANF, veteran's benefits, or military or clergy allowances, 6) current bank statements and records of stocks, bonds, mutual funds and other investments, 7) documentation of non-taxable income, such as welfare, Social Security Income, AFDC and Veterans Benefits, 8) business or farm records (if applicable), 9) alien registration cards (if not an U.S. citizen), 10) records relating to any unusual family financial circumstances, such as medical and dental expenses not covered by health insurance, unusually high child care costs, death, divorce, and loss of unemployment.</p>
