1. Practice counting aloud to 10. Count a variety of objects in your home (up to 10).
2. Sort all of the silverware in your kitchen.
3. Look for the letters Aa—Dd in print in books, magazines and around the house. Check for those letters on signs too!
4. Look for signs of the seasons while driving.
5. Play rhyming games/sing rhyming songs
6. Practice writing your first name.
7. Practice patterning with shoes and socks. Find lots of patterns in your home.
